


IN 2010, THE SECTION DISTRIBUTED MORE THAN 300 RESOURCE PACKETS TO CATHOLIC AND OTHER CHURCHES FOR ST. FRANCIS DAY; HELD A TWO-DAY MEETING FOR 30 MAJOR RELIGIOUS LEADERS AT HSUS HEADQUARTERS; HOSTED PET WELLNESS CLINICS AT FIVE CHURCHES; CREATED ANIMAL MINISTRY PROGRAMS AT OVER 25 CHURCHES; OBTAINED SUPPORT FOR HSUS POLICIES FROM OVER 100 PASTORS; AND PRESENTED AT 10 CHURCHES AND CATHEDRALS.

BONDS AND WORKS WITH SHELTERS AND RESCUE GROUPS TO PREVENT ANIMAL SUFFERING WHEN THAT BOND BREAKS. COMPANION ANIMALS INTERACTS WITH THE PUBLIC ON A LARGE NUMBER OF ISSUES, INCLUDING SPAYING AND NEUTERING, TETHERING OF DOGS, GREYHOUND RACING, MICRO CHIPPING, AND THE TREATMENT OF FERAL CATS.

THE SHELTER PET PROJECT, A CAMPAIGN OF THE HSUS, THE AD COUNCIL, AND MADDIE'S FUND, RANKS IN THE TOP TEN IN DONATED MEDIA OF ALL THE AD COUNCIL'S CURRENT CAMPAIGNS.

AS PART OF SPAW DAY 2010, AN ANNUAL EVENT TO SAVE ANIMAL LIVES BY SPAWING OR NEUTERING PETS, THE HSUS AND ITS AFFILIATE HUMANE SOCIETY INTERNATIONAL LAUNCHED AN ONLINE PET PHOTO CONTEST. ENTRANTS IN THE CONTEST COULD FUNDRAISE ON BEHALF OF NEARLY 300 ELIGIBLE SPAW DAY EVENT ORGANIZERS. OVERALL, MORE THAN 500 LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS, VETERINARY

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CLINICS, AND INDIVIDUALS HOSTED SPAW DAY EVENTS IN 49 STATES, THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, FOUR U.S. TERRITORIES, AND 39 OTHER COUNTRIES, RESULTING IN MORE THAN 63,000 SPAW/NEUTER SURGERIES WORLDWIDE.

THE HSUS CONTINUED ITS INITIATIVES TO HELP SHELTERS IMPROVE THEIR WORK FOR ANIMALS AT THE COMMUNITY LEVEL. OUR SHELTER SERVICES TEAM PROVIDED EXPERT ADVICE AND GUIDELINES ON SHELTER OPERATIONS, STANDARDS, AND LEADERSHIP TO HUNDREDS OF LOCAL AGENCIES IN 2010.

THE HSUS'S END DOGFIGHTING PROGRAM EXPOSED MORE THAN 3,000 AT-RISK YOUTH TO OUR END DOGFIGHTING PROGRAM IN ATLANTA AND CHICAGO, WITH NFL PLAYER AND FORMER DOGFIGHTER MICHAEL VICK SPEAKING TO CHILDREN IN A NUMBER OF COMMUNITIES ABOUT THE CRUELTY AND DEAD-END PATH OF DOGFIGHTING. SOME 470 CHILDREN IN ATLANTA AND CHICAGO PARTICIPATED IN CANINES AND COMMUNITIES, AN EIGHT-WEEK HUMANE EDUCATION AND ANTI-DOGFIGHTING COURSE, AND THE HSUS LAUNCHED THE END DOGFIGHTING PROGRAM IN A THIRD CITY, PHILADELPHIA.

THE PETS FOR LIFE NYC PROGRAM HELPED 7076 PEOPLE WITH GUIDANCE TO PREVENT PET RELINQUISHMENT.

IN THE GULF COAST STATES, 4173 PETS RECEIVED CARE AND SERVICE AT VACCINATION AND SPAW/NEUTER OUTREACH EVENTS CO-SPONSORED BY THE HSUS. THE HSUS ALSO GAVE ADDITIONAL SUPPORT TO THE ST. BERNARD ANIMAL SHELTER IN LOUISIANA, PART OF ITS ONGOING COMMITMENT TO LONG-TERM RECONSTRUCTION OF HUMANE INFRASTRUCTURE IN THE GULF COAST REGION. WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE HSUS, AN EMERGENCY SHELTER AND ANIMAL CARE FACILITY ON THE GROUNDS OF THE DIXON CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTE IN JACKSON,

EQUINE PROTECTION

THE EQUINE PROTECTION PROGRAM EDUCATES PEOPLE ABOUT RESPONSIBLE HORSE

OWNERSHIP AND COMPANIONSHIP, CONFRONTS CRUELTY, NEGLECT AND OTHER FORMS

OF MISTREATMENT OF HORSES, AND SUPPORTS THE PROFESSIONALIZATION OF

HORSE RESCUE ACTIVITY IN THE UNITED STATES. THE HSUS ENCOURAGES THE

RESPONSIBLE REMOVAL OF HORSES (INCLUDING ADOPTION) AND - AS A LAST

RESORT HUMANE EUTHANASIA, AS ALTERNATIVES TO SLAUGHTER, WORKS FOR AN

END TO SHIPMENTS OF AMERICAN HORSES TO SLAUGHTER PLANTS IN MEXICO AND

CANADA, PASSES FOR REFORM WITHIN THE TENNESSEE WALKING HORSE INDUSTRY,

AND WORKS WITH THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT TO IMPLEMENT HUMANE

TREATMENT OF WILD HORSES.

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ANIMAL RESEARCH ISSUES

THE ANIMAL RESEARCH ISSUES DEPARTMENT WORKS TO MINIMIZE AND EVENTUALLY END HARM TO ANIMALS IN LABORATORIES THROUGH POLICY EFFORTS, WORK WITH SCIENTISTS, AND PUBLIC OUTREACH. IN 2010 THE HSUS AND OTHER PARTNERS LAUNCHED THE HUMAN TOXICOLOGY PROJECT CONSORTIUM TO ADVANCE NON-ANIMAL TOXICOLOGY TESTING OVER THE NEXT DECADE. THE SECTION'S PAIN AND DISTRESS INITIATIVE SEEKS TO END ALL PAIN AND DISTRESS IN ANIMALS IN RESEARCH BY THE YEAR 2020. IN 2010 THE HSUS CHALLENGED UNIVERSITIES CONDUCTING ANIMAL RESEARCH TO ADOPT POLICIES PROHIBITING SEVERE SUFFERING THROUGH PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT AND MEDIA PRESSURE, HIGHLIGHTING VIOLATIONS OF ANIMAL RESEARCH POLICIES. THE SECTION ALSO CHAMPIONS AN END TO THE USE OF CHIMPANZEES IN INVASIVE RESEARCH, AND A SANCTUARY PROGRAM FOR THEIR PERMANENT RETIREMENT IN THE U.S. IN 2010, THE HSUS PRESSED FOR THE RETIREMENT OF 2020 GOVERNMENT OWNED CHIMPANZEES IN A HIGH PROFILE CASE.

WILDLIFE

THE WILDLIFE AND HABITAT PROTECTION SECTION PROMOTES THE PROTECTION AND HUMANE TREATMENT OF ALL WILDLIFE, CAPTIVE AND FREE, AS WELL AS THE MAINTENANCE OF QUALITY WILDLIFE HABITAT, AND SEEKS TO FOSTER RESPECT AND APPRECIATION FOR WILD ANIMALS AND NATURE. THE SECTION CONCENTRATES ITS EFFORTS ON SEALS, WILD HORSES, ABUSED WILDLIFE, DEPLETED MARINE AND MIGRATORY SPECIES, URBAN WILDLIFE, AND A HOST OF INDIVIDUAL SPECIES AND SITUATIONS IN NEED OF HUMANE INTERVENTION.

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IN ITS WORK, THE SECTION PROMOTES HUMANE WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT PRACTICESAND THOSE THAT PRESERVE BIOLOGICAL DIVERSITY AND FUNCTIONAL ECOSYSTEMSON PUBLIC LANDS, AND ADVOCATES FOR THE RESPONSIBLE AND HUMANEMANAGEMENT AND CONSERVATION OF THREATENED, ENDANGERED, AND OTHERSENSITIVE SPECIES. MEMBERS OF THE SECTION PROVIDE SCIENTIFIC ANDPOLICY ADVICE AND SUPPORT ON A RANGE OF WILDLIFE PROTECTION ISSUES,SUCH AS HUNTING AND TRAPPING OR THE PROTECTION OF SENSITIVE ORENDANGERED WILDLIFE FROM URBAN DEVELOPMENT OR OTHER CAUSES OF HABITATLOSS.THE SECTION PRODUCES ANALYSES OF WILDLIFE AND ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENTPLANS AT BOTH THE STATE AND FEDERAL LEVELS, ON PREDATOR AND OTHERWILDLIFE DAMAGE CONTROL INITIATIVES; FOCUSES ON THE TREATMENT OF WILDANIMALS IN CAPTIVE SETTINGS, INCLUDING ZOOS AND AQUARIAS, AUCTIONS, THEEXOTIC MEAT INDUSTRY, CANNED HUNTS, AND OTHER SITUATIONS; CAMPAIGNSAGAINST THE TRAPPING AND KILLING OF ANIMALS FOR RECREATIONAL ANDCOMMERCIAL PURPOSES; PROMOTES THE IMPLEMENTATION OFIMMUNO CONTRACEPTION TECHNIQUES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF MULTIPLE SPECIES;CARRIES OUT A NUMBER OF INITIATIVES TO PROTECT WHALES AND OTHER MARINEMAMMALS; DISCOURSES THE KEEPING OF WILD ANIMALS AS PETS, AND WORKSTHROUGH ITS SAFE CATS PROGRAM TOWARD SOLUTIONS FOR THE CHALLENGES OFFREE-ROAMING CAT POPULATIONS.THE HSUS MAINTAINS AN URBAN WILDLIFE PROGRAM, TOO, WHICH SEEKS TOHARMONIZE HUMAN RELATIONSHIPS WITH WILD ANIMALS LIVING IN OR NEAR HUMANCOMMUNITIES. THROUGH ITS WILD NEIGHBORS INITIATIVES, THE HSUS HELPSTHOSE ATTEMPTING TO ADDRESS CONFLICTS RELATING TO WILD ANIMALS IN ORAROUND THEIR HOMES OR COMMUNITIES, THROUGH HUMANE, EFFECTIVE032212  
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APPROACHES. THE PROGRAM ALSO HELPS THOSE SEEKING TO MANAGE THEIR PROPERTIES TO INCREASE ATTRACTIVENESS AND CONSERVATION VALUE FOR CERTAIN SPECIES OF WILDLIFE. BY HELPING PEOPLE TO BETTER UNDERSTAND, APPRECIATE AND RELATE TO THE WILD ANIMALS WITH WHOM THEY SHARE THEIR LIVES EVERY DAY, THE PROGRAM AIMS TO HELP INSTILL THE VALUES ESSENTIAL TO PROTECTING WILDLIFE EVERYWHERE.

IN 2010, THE SECTION CONTINUED ITS INVESTMENTS IN HIGH PROFILE VISUAL CAMPAIGNS AND PERSONAL WITNESS, HIGH LEVEL AND GRASSROOTS ACTION IN CANADA, AND IN AN EXPANDING SEAFOOD BOYCOTT IN THE UNITED STATES AND WESTERN EUROPE TO END THE CANADIAN HARP SEAL SLAUGHTER. ITS SHARK FREE MARINA INITIATIVE CERTIFIED SPORT FISHING AND RESORT MARINAS AS "SHARK-FREE" I.E., PROHIBITING ANY SHARK FROM BEING LANDED AT THEIR DOCKS. THE SECTION ADVOCATED PROTECTIONS FOR ENDANGERED MARINE SPECIES, AS IN ITS PETITION TO THE NATIONAL MARINE FISHERIES SERVICE TO LIST PORBEAGLE SHARKS UNDER THE ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT, AND SETTLED ITS LITIGATION WITH THE SAME AGENCY CONCERNING THE IMPACT OF LOBSTER FISHERIES ON ENDANGERED HUMPBACK AND RIGHT WHALES. THE SECTION FOCUSED CONSIDERABLE ATTENTION AND RESOURCES ON THE BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT'S WILD HORSE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM AND, AS A SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTOR TO THE DEVELOPMENT AND USE OF IMMUNO-CONTRACEPTIVES, PREPARED A POSITION PAPER ON PORCINE PELLUCIDA VACCINE AS A HUMAN POPULATION REDUCTION AGENT IN HORSES. THE SECTION CAMPAIGNED AGAINST THE WORST PREDATOR CONTROL PRACTICES EMPLOYED OR SANCTIONED BY THE USDA'S WILDLIFE SERVICES DIVISION, IN A FEW LOCATIONS (ROCK CREEK PARK, WASHINGTON, DC; CAPE COD NATIONAL SEASHORE; ASSATEAGUE ISLAND NATIONAL SEASHORES; AND POINT REYES NATIONAL SEASHORE), THE SECTION ENGAGED THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE

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ON EQUINE, UNGULATE, PREDATOR, AND EXOTIC SPECIES MANAGEMENT POLICIESAND PROCEDURES. THE SECTION COMMENTED ON PROPOSED BARRED OWL REMOVALEXPERIMENTS IN THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST.THE PRAIRIE DOG COALITION, A PROGRAM OF THE HSUS, WORKS TO STOPPoisoning, shooting and bulldozing of prairie dog colonies in a numberof western states. The program moved nearly 1000 prairie dogs fromcolonies at risk of being poisoned.THE HSUS COATS FOR CUBS PROGRAM RECYCLED OVER 300 FURS FOR USE INWILDLIFE REHABILITATION CENTERS.A SPECIAL WILDLIFE ASSESSMENT GROUP TRAVELED TO THE GULF COAST TOEVALUATE THE ECOLOGICAL IMPACTS OF THE DEEPWATER HORIZON OIL SPILL INTHE REGION.INTERNATIONAL:PRIMARILY THROUGH ITS AFFILIATE HUMANE SOCIETY INTERNATIONAL (HSI), THEHSUS PROTECTS ANIMALS BEYOND THE U.S. BORDERS, BECAUSE ANIMALPROTECTION CONCERNs HAVE A STRONG INTERNATIONAL DIMENSION. 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THE HSUS EMPLOYED STATE DIRECTORS IN 36 STATES DURING 2010. STATE DIRECTORS ADVANCE ANIMAL PROTECTION IN OUTREACH TO THE PUBLIC, NETWORK WITH GRASSROOTS ADVOCATES, LEGISLATORS, AND OTHERS, ASSIST LOCAL SHELTERS AND HELP WITH HSUS FIELD RESCUE WORK. STATE DIRECTORS WORK TO ADVANCE THE HSUS'S AGENDA BY HELPING TO PURSUE CORPORATE AND INSTITUTIONAL POLICY CHANGES LIKE CAGE-FREE EGGS, SEAFOOD BOYCOTT PLEDGES, OR PUPPY-FRIENDLY COMMITMENTS, WORK WITH DISASTER AND OTHER RESPONDERS IN EMERGENCIES AFFECTING ANIMALS, AND BUILD VOLUNTEER NETWORKS OF LIKE-MINDED SUPPORTERS IN THEIR INDIVIDUAL STATES.

WITH OTHER STAFF MEMBERS, STATE DIRECTORS SUPPORTED EFFORTS TO PASS 98 PRO-ANIMAL STATE LAWS AND REGULATIONS, 67 OF THEM ADDRESSING PET PROTECTION ISSUES SUCH AS SPAY/NEUTER, PET TRUSTS, DISASTER PLANNING, DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, HUMANE EUTHANASIA, AND ANTIFREEZE POISONING, AND 19 OF THEM DEALING WITH WILDLIFE ISSUES SUCH AS POACHING, THE EXOTIC PET TRADE, AND CAPTIVE SHOOTING, DURING 2010.

ANIMAL PROTECTION LITIGATION:

THE HSUS ANIMAL PROTECTION LITIGATION SECTION WON A DOZEN MAJOR RULINGS IN 2010, AND SUFFERED JUST ONE LOSS, IN THE SUPREME COURT'S DECISION TO STRIKE DOWN A FEDERAL BAN ON ANIMAL CRUSH VIDEOS. VICTORIES INCLUDED A MAJOR WATER POLLUTION CASE AGAINST A LEADING PRODUCER OF FOIE GRAS, A LAWSUIT OVER FALSE ADVERTISING AND MISLABELING OF FUR GARMENTS BY SOME OF THE NATION'S LARGEST DEPARTMENT STORES AND FASHION DESIGNERS, A LAWSUIT TO HALT THE SLAUGHTER OF WOLVES AND REINSTATEMENT FEDERAL ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT PROTECTIONS, AND TWO RULINGS IN THE NINTH CIRCUIT COURT. IN THE FIRST, THE COURT OVERTURNED A LOWER COURT

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53-0225390INJUNCTION BLOCKING A CALIFORNIA LAW THAT BANNED THE USE OF SICK ANDDISABLED ANIMALS IN THE HUMAN FOOD SUPPLY. IN THE SECOND, IT HALTEDTHE KILLING OF FEDERALLY PROTECTED SEA LIONS AT THE BONNEVILLE DAM.HSUS LITIGATION WORK ALSO RESULTED IN NEW HABITAT PROTECTIONS FOR RIGHTWHALES, A HALT TO A NEW MIGRATORY BIRD HUNTING PROGRAM AT PRIME HOOKNATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE, A PARK SERVICE DECISION TO CANCEL A PROGRAMTO POISON CROWS, A RULING THAT THE OHIO GAMEPOWL BREEDERS ASSOCIATIONVIOLATED CAMPAIGN FINANCE LAWS, THE REJECTION OF A CHALLENGE TO THENEWLY ENHANCED FEDERAL ANIMAL FIGHTING STATUTE, AND A RULING THAT HELDTHAT THERE IS NO CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHT TO OPERATE A PUPPY MILL FREE OFSTATE REGULATION.CAMPAIGNS:THE HSUS PURSUES A NUMBER OF HIGH-PRIORITY ISSUES THROUGH A CAMPAIGNSSECTION THAT FOCUSES EXTRA ATTENTION AND RESOURCES ON DYNAMIC PROGRESS.CURRENTLY, THE CAMPAIGNS SECTION WORKS ON ANIMAL CRUELTY AND ANIMALFIGHTING, FACTORY FARMING, PUPPY MILLS, WILDLIFE ABUSE, AND PUR-FREE.FACTORY FARMING CAMPAIGN:THE HSUS' END FACTORY FARMING CAMPAIGN WORKS WITH CONSUMERS,CORPORATIONS AND POLICY MAKERS TO SPUR REFORM IN THE TREATMENT OFANIMALS RAISED FOR FOOD. 2010 ACCOMPLISHMENTS INCLUDE 100 COMMITMENTSBY EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, AND 100 COMMITMENTS FROM RESTAURANTS,INCLUDING MAJOR CHAINS LIKE SUBWAY, AND FROM CORPORATIONS (INCLUDINGKRAFT FOODS, HELLMANN'S, AND SARA LEE) TO IMPROVE ANIMAL WELFAREPURCHASING POLICIES IN RELATION TO CAGE-FREE EGGS. THE SECTION ALSO

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WORKED ON EFFORTS TO SECURE A LANDMARK COMMITMENT TO FARM ANIMAL WELFARE REFORMS IN THE STATE OF OHIO, A NEW LAW IN CALIFORNIA THAT WOULD BAN BATTERY CAGES IN EGG PRODUCTION, AND CONTINUING EFFORTS TO PREVENT THE USE OF DOWNER ANIMALS IN THE FOOD SUPPLY. THE SECTION PREPARED FOR AND MANAGED A NUMBER OF CORPORATE SHAREHOLDER RESOLUTIONS FOCUSING ON THE HUMANE TREATMENT OF ANIMALS IN FOOD PRODUCTION. THE HSUS SUPPORTS SUSTAINABLE AND HUMANE FARMING PRACTICES, AND ENCOURAGES THE PUBLIC TO FOLLOW THE 3 RS OF EATING, I.E., REDUCTION OF CONSUMPTION OF ANIMAL PRODUCTS, REFINEMENT, BY SELECTING ANIMAL PRODUCTS NOT DERIVED FROM FACTORY FARMING, AND REPLACEMENT, THE INCORPORATION OF VEGETARIAN FOODS INTO THE DIET.

PUPPY MILLS CAMPAIGN:

THE STOP PUPPY MILLS CAMPAIGN PROMOTES ANIMAL SHELTERS INSTEAD OF PET STORES AS THE PRIORITY SOURCE FOR ADOPTING ANIMALS, WHILE SEEKING TO HIGHLIGHT THE PROBLEMS ASSOCIATED WITH EXTREME BREEDING PRACTICES AND HIGH-VOLUME COMMERCIAL BREEDING ENTERPRISES. THE SECTION SUPPORTS RESPONSIBLE DOG BREEDERS BY GIVING INFORMATION TO THE PUBLIC ON HOW TO SELECT A BREEDER, AND BY WORKING WITH A BREEDERS COUNCIL. THE SECTION SUPPORTED PUPPY MILL ACTION WEEK NATIONWIDE DURING THE MOTHER'S DAY PERIOD. THE SECTION ISSUED A "DIRTY DOZEN" REPORT HIGHLIGHTING SOME OF THE WORST LICENSED PUPPY MILLS IN MISSOURI.

THE SECTION HELPED LAW ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITIES TO RESCUE ANIMALS FROM A NUMBER OF MASS DOG BREEDING FACILITIES, HELPED TO ENACT 11 NEW LAWS TO HELP IMPROVE CONDITIONS IN PUPPY MILLS, AND REACHED A MILESTONE OF 1000 PET STORES THAT PLEDGED NOT TO SELL PUPPIES. THE SECTION ALSO WORKED

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IN SUPPORT OF THE SUCCESSFUL MISSOURI BALLOT INITIATIVE TO REGULATEHIGH VOLUME COMMERCIAL BREEDERS OF DOGS.ANIMAL CRUELTY AND FIGHTING:THE HSUS'S ANIMAL CRUELTY AND FIGHTING CAMPAIGN WORKS TO END MALICIOUSACTS OF CRUELTY AND ALL FORMS OF ANIMAL FIGHTING, AND TO SENSITIZE THEPUBLIC AND PROFESSIONAL AUDIENCES ABOUT THE CONNECTION BETWEEN CRUELTYTO ANIMALS AND INTERPERSONAL VIOLENCE. THE SECTION, IN SUPPORT OF STATE WILDLIFE AGENCIES AND OTHER PARTIES, OFFERED \$140,000 IN REWARDS FOR INFORMATION LEADING TO THE ARREST AND CONVICTION OF WILDLIFE POACHERS, GAINING PUBLICITY IN 222 SEPARATE MEDIA PIECES. PROGRAM REPRESENTATIVES ALSO SPOKE AT TWO MAJOR WILDLIFE LAW ENFORCEMENT CONFERENCES.

FUR-FREE:

THE HSUS FUR FREE CAMPAIGN SEEKS TO DISCOURAGE THE PUBLIC FROM WEARING FUR, WORKS WITH RETAILERS AND DESIGNERS TO ENCOURAGE THEM TO GO FUR FREE, AND TO MONITOR THE MARKETPLACE FOR FALSELY LABELED ITEMS THAT MIGHT CONTAIN FUR. THE SECTION SECURED A NUMBER OF COMMITMENTS FROM MAJOR RETAILERS AND COMPANIES TO GO FUR-FREE, INCLUDING STEIN MART, WITH 265 STORES IN 30 STATES. MORE THAN 100 DESIGNERS AND RETAILERS HAVE JOINED THE HSUS'S FUR-FREE LIST, WHICH NOW INCLUDES MORE THAN 300 COMPANIES WORLDWIDE. RETAILERS LIKE CACHO, OAKLEY, DIESEL, LANE BRYANT, CHICO'S, AND WHITE HOUSE/BLACK MARKET HAVE ALIGNED WITH THE HSUS TO ENCOURAGE THE USE OF ALTERNATIVES TO ANIMAL FUR AND REACH OUR CONSTITUENCY OF ETHICALLY CONSCIOUS CONSUMERS.

THE RETAILERS AGREED TO IMPOSE STRICT NEW LABELING PRACTICES, CHANGE ADVERTISING POLICIES, AND/OR ENDORSE PUR LABELING LEGISLATION. THE HSUS ALSO WORKED WITH THE CBS LOS ANGELES AFFILIATE, CBS2/KCAL9, ON AN EMMY-WINNING INVESTIGATIVE NEWS REPORT THAT FOUND UNLABELED ANIMAL PUR GARMENTS BEING SOLD AS FAUX PUR.
